Attendees

- Many individuals attended multiple games so total attendance was much higher, but there were approximately 2,700 unique visitors to the Babe Ruth Baseball 14-Year-Old World Series
- 59% of attendees stayed in hotels, motels, etc.
 - Most of these individuals stayed 7 to 10 nights
 - Approximately 1,500 room nights
- 10% of attendees stayed with friends and relatives
 - Most of these individuals stayed 4 to 7 nights
- 31% of attendees were day trippers or local residents

 - Estimates provided by Corry Locke, Sports
 Marketing Specialist for Marion County VCB
 - Tourism database at Kerr & Downs Research
 - Interviews conducted by Kerr & Downs Research with 78 attendees of the Babe Truth Tournament
